#### Got a problem you need help with?

Perhaps you're new here and just looking to solve a particular problem. That's fine, we like to help, but please check the Moodle documentation first, particularly the **frequently asked questions**, to make sure your question isn't already answered in there. You should also try searching the forums or a Google search of moodle.org to see if you can find another discussion about your topic.

If you still can't find the answer, then post a query into the most appropriate forum, providing as much relevant background information as you can and stating the version of Moodle you are using. Please post in only one forum. It is likely someone will be able to help you very soon.

#### Found a bug?

If you've found an obvious bug that doesn't really need discussion, please post it directly in the Moodle Tracker. Include as much relevant detail as possible so that others can understand and reproduce the bug.

If possible, research and include a solution to the bug - this really helps the core developers include a fix into Moodle as soon as possible.

#### Want to help?


As a participant in the longer term, you should consider what you are putting in to the community as well as what you are getting out of it. Here are some suggestions:

- If you see an unanswered question from someone and you know the answer to it, then answer it!
- Add ratings to other people's postings so that they get some feedback. Ratings are also used to determine particularly helpful Moodlers.
- Transfer useful content from forum discussions, such as frequently asked questions and answers, or ideas/suggestions of ways of using a particular feature, to the Moodle documentation wiki.
- If you have a suggestion for a new feature, provide a mock screenshot so people can see exactly what you are talking about. If you know some
  coding, then snippets of code are always appreciated.
