General Course Settings: This course is set up so that information is accessed either by clicking on the name in Topic 1 or by using the Navigation Menu. The Additional Resources topic is hidden so that only the teacher can see it.

Digital Parking Lot: You will need to create your own account and screen at wiffiti.com. When you create your account and appropriate screen, you will need to edit the Digital Parking Lot web page. Put your new screen number in the text in place of the Xs. Then take the embed code from your newly created screen and replace the HTML code currently on the page.

Digital Citizenship Introduction: This presentation connects the terms "citizen" and "technology" to help students understand how the term Digital Citizenship was coined. This presentation is the basis for the model Cornell Notes page in the Cornell Notes presentation.
